BABY ALYSSA VISITS COUNTY JUDGE'S OFFICE




Baby Alyssa Natalia Mata with Judge Tijerina

Do you think baby Alyssa may want a part-time job as a receptionist? Betty watch out!



EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED: WORK ZONE AWARENESS WEEK



TX-Dot joined forces with other local entities to promote Work Zone Awareness Week in the Laredo/Webb County area

March 23rd-27th is Work Zone Awareness Week in Webb County and across the nation as well. It is important for drivers to pay attention to construction workers and reduce their speed in work zones.

Last year, there were 19,393 accidents in roadway construction and maintenance zones in Texas. Several organizations joined forces in this campaign; its main objective to remind drivers to slow down and remain alert while driving through work and construction zones.

TxDOT's Be Safe Drive Smart campaign reminds drivers to:

- *Slow down*
- *Pay attention*
- *Observe all traffic signs*
- *Put cell phones down*
- *Be patient*
- *Don't tailgate*
- *Move Over, Slow Down outside of work zones for law enforcement and TxDOT vehicles and personnel*
